

MODERN EXPANSION TO A 100-YEAR-OLD COTTAGE

In Cremorne, the architect Axel Richter designed a modern three-storey extension to an over 100-year-old Victorian house, skilfully combining new and old. Using KLH® - CLT, we were able to bring the vision to life, creating a 54m2 structure on the 49m2 footprint of the previous extensions and realise a modern structure that retains the warmth and charm of the historic building. Seen from the street, the new building blends seamlessly into the streetscape, but when you enter the original house, your gaze is drawn through the house into the light-flooded, spacious living-dining area. Large windows and open-plan layouts create an airy atmosphere and

seamlessly connect the interior with the exterior. Axel Richter's three-storey extension is a successful example of how modern design and traditional architecture can merge to create a unique and appealing home that is both aesthetically pleasing and functional.
